FDTC's Motivation and Scope

FDTC is the annual workshop focusing on Fault Diagnosis and Tolerance in Cryptography. In recent years applied cryptography has developed considerably to satisfy the increasing security requirements of various information technology disciplines, e.g., telecommunications, networking, data base systems and mobile applications. Cryptosystems are inherently computationally complex and in order to satisfy the high throughput requirements of many applications, they are often implemented by means of either VLSI devices (crypto-accelerators) or highly optimized software routines (crypto-libraries) and are used via suitable (network) protocols. The high complexity of such implementations raises concerns regarding their reliability. Research is therefore needed to develop methodologies and techniques for designing robust cryptographic systems (both hardware and software), and to protect them against both accidental faults and intentional intrusions and attacks, in particular those based on the malicious injection of faults into the device for the purpose of extracting the secret key. This workshop was started in 2004 and had annual follow-ups since then. The number of participants has steadily grown to more than 100 in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016, 2018 and 2025.
